The LRNRD is in a NON-Compact Call Year

How much can we pump in a Non-Compact Call Year?

In a Non-Compact Call Year, you can pump as much as your allocation balance will let you. There is no limit or penalty, but remember, whatever you pump will be deducted from your current allocation balance and then that balance will need to carry you through the rest of the allocation period.

Example: We are in year 4 of the 5 year allocation period.

Your allocation balance shows after three years—28.5 inches

You pump in the fourth year (2021)—10.0 inches

Your balance—18.5 inches left (At the end of the 2021 irrigation season)

This balance will be the volume left for the final year of the allocation period. (2022)

Up to nine inches may be carried over to the next allocation period. (2023—2027)

<u>Irrigation Season—</u> <u>Flowmeters</u>

Please check flowmeters on your wells periodically throughout the irrigation season. Making sure they are working correctly benefits both the Lower Republican NRD and you, the irrigator, for accurate irrigation records. It is your responsibility to make sure the flowmeters are functioning correctly during the irrigation season. If you have a problem with a meter, please contact our office.



Water Resources Technician Areas

The Lower Republican NRD has 3 Water Resources Technicians to cover the district. The western area is covered by Mark Bantam. NSWCP FUNDING

The Lower Republican NRD will be receiving funding for the Nebraska Soil and Water Conservation Program in July. The program has three major categories: range, erosion, and water conservation and water quality. Some eligible conservation practices include range seeding, critical area plantings, planned grazing systems, irrigation water management, terrace systems, impoundment dams, grade stabilization structures, diversions, grassed waterways and water and sediment control basins. The projects must be designed by the Natural Resources Conservation Service in your area. The LRNRD cost shares on 50% of the average or actual cost of the project, whichever is less with a maximum of \$5000 per year. 2022 Tree Planting

You may be asking, "Why are they talking about tree planting for next year?". The most successful tree plantings are those that are thought of long in advance of planting the trees. It's especially important to have the site properly prepared prior to tree planting. If the site is currently in native grass, alfalfa, or in a location where trees have been recently removed, tilling the site and allowing moisture infiltration and the soil to mellow will significantly enhance tree survival rates next spring. The site should be tilled at least once this summer/fall and again just prior to tree planting.
