Adventure Camp About the Environment

Whether it's a reptile wrapped around a wrist or a cool splash in the Middle Loup River, Adventure Camp about the Environment, ACE Camp, has something to offer this summer. The Lower Republican NRD is currently accepting registrations for ACE Camp. The Camp will be held June 26th through the 29th at the State 4-H Youth Camp near Halsey. We encourage middle school students interested in outdoors to sign up for this educational, action-packed camp. To qualify, students should have completed sixth, seventh or eighth grade in the 2021-2022 school year.

The 4 day adventure camp provides students an opportunity to dive into different hands-on activities with a natural resources focus. Sessions educate youth on Nebraska's water resources, wildlife, soil, trees, range

and grasslands, technology and more. ACE Camp gets students outdoors to explore the world around them.

Fees and registration are \$235 per camper. If your child is interested, please contact the Lower Republican NRD. We offer 2 camp scholarships and they are on a first come, first served basis. Space is **limited**, so campers are encouraged to register early.

Nebraska Youth Range Camp

Occupation Tax Exemption—Chemigation Permits—Pooling June 1st Deadlines

<u>Chemigation Permits</u>—The chemigation permit renewal fee is \$15. After June 1st they will be considered a new permit and will be charged \$50. All irrigated fields that utilize chemigation are required to have a permit. Chemigation Forms can be found on our website at www.lrnrd.org under the News and Information Tab. If you have questions, please contact Shirlee at 308-928-2182.

Occupation Tax Exemption Form — The LRNRD Occupation Tax Exempt form needs to be completed if:

- You do not plan to irrigate part or all of your certified irrigated acres in 2022
- Your certified irrigated acres are enrolled in a government program, i.e. EQIP, CREP, etc.

If you do not have certified irrigated acres or you plan to irrigate all of your certified irrigated aces in 2022, you do not need to complete this form.

<u>Pooling</u>—Pooling arrangements must be completed by this date for the 2022 irrigation season. Existing arrangements will continue unless written cancellation is received by June 1st. The LRNRD is in a NON-Compact Call Year

2022 will be a NON-Compact Call Year. Even though there is no "hard cap" or maximum allocation cap in 2022, the volume of water pumped this year is still deducted from your current allocation balance for the 5-year period. This year, 2022, is year 5 of the 5-year allocation period. Up to 9 inches may be carried over into the next allocation period (2023-2027) based on the remaining balance.

Gosper—Furnas County Fire

As this newsletter was heading to the printer, we had just experienced a historic wildfire affecting our district in Furnas county between Arapahoe and Edison. The Lower Republican NRD encourages irrigators in those fire damaged areas to contact our office if they needed to use groundwater in fighting the fires, or have since used wells for dust control or establishing a cover crop in the burn areas. For those flow meters which may be fire damaged, we will be sending our technicians to inspect and evaluate the condition of each meter within this area. If any of these meters require repair or replacement, the Lower Republican NRD will contact you regarding the next steps being implemented.
